| 3 | The student writes an opening paragraph that states an opinion directed at a specific audience. May include differing opinions. <br> (2 possible points) | 2 pts - 2 or more sentences that meet the criteria $1 \mathrm{pt}-1$ sentence that meets the criteria $\mathbf{0}$ pts - no opening or opening does not meet the criteria |
| 4 | The student writes a closing paragraph that differs from the opening, emphasizes the opinion, and is directed at a specific audience. May include a differing opinion. (2 possible points) | 2 pts - 2 or more sentences that meet the criteria $1 \mathrm{pt}-1$ sentence that meets the criteria 0 pts - no closing or closing does not meet the criteria |
| 5 | The student writes a general, rather than personal, stand-alone reason statement for each reason introduced. <br> (2 possible points) | 2 pts - all reason statements meet the criteria 1 pt - all but 1 meet the criteria $\mathbf{0}$ pts - more than 1 reason statement fails to meet the criteria. |
| 6 | The student acknowledges the opposing view either in a phrase or sentence at least 3 times. <br> (2 possible points) | 2 pts - acknowledges opposition 3 or more times 1 pt - acknowledges opposition 2 times $\mathbf{0}$ pts - acknowledges opposition fewer than 2 times |
| 7 | The student uses varied transition words and phrases to "move" the writing logically. There are more phrases than words. <br> (2 possible points) | 2 pts - at least 6 transitions that meet the criteria 1 pt - 4-5 transitions that meet the criteria 0 pts - fewer than 4 transitions that meet the criteria |
| 8 | The student provided detail in the form of examples or explanations for each of the stated reasons. Includes some reference to opposing opinion. <br> (3 possible points) | 3 pts - 4 or more examples for each reason that meet the criteria <br> 2 pts - at least 3 examples for each reason that meet the criteria <br> $\mathbf{0}$ pts - fewer than 3 examples for each reason that meet the criteria |
